Overview

Multiple components: material submission prior to the conference and an interview. The Future Business Leader event also includes an objective test.

Specific Guidelines

- Objective Test: 50 minutes RLC; 60 minutes SLC. Must take test prior to both conferences via school-site testing. Test score is added into the preliminary interview rating sheet. (see competencies below)
- Cover Letter: The one-page cover letter should state reasons for deserving the honor of this award. Address to: Ms. Jean Buckley, President and CEO, FBLA-PBL, 1912 Association Drive, Reston, VA 20191
- Résumé: Not to exceed two pages, should list your FBLA activities and involvement

Objective Test Competencies

- FBLA Organization, Bylaws, and Handbook
- National Competitive Event Guidelines
- National Publications
- Creed and National Goals
- Business Knowledge, i.e., Accounting, Banking, Law, etc.

Procedure

Prejudged

- Competitors will submit pre-judged materials to the regional director and state office by the date established annually.

Interview

- Competitors must bring four (4) hard copy of résumé and cover letter, to be left with the judges in a properly labeled folder.
- Label folders with the event title, competitor's name, region, and school. Include the competitor's name on all pages submitted.
- Résumés should be brief, not exceeding two (2) pages. Photographs are not allowed.
- Judges will conduct a ten (10) minute interview.
- Objective tests scores will be used to break a tie.

Eligibility

- Each chapter may submit two entries. The first- and second-place regional winner will compete at the state level.
- Competitors must pay dues by March 1.

Presentation

Performance: 10 minutes

Warning: 9 minutes

A panel of judges will select the winners; all decisions are final. The number of awards presented will be determined by the judges. The maximum number of awards will be three (3) at the regional level and five (5) at the state level.
